The ORDINIS Framework™ connects source truth, governance, semantic meaning, validated implementation, executive action, and controlled evolution through one repeatable six-stage operating model.

01 Discover & Align SOURCE TRUTH Clarify the executive decision, scope, stakeholders, and source landscape.	02 Decision Foundation GOVERNANCE Set ownership, authority, boundaries, and acceptance rules.
03 Define Intelligence SEMANTIC MODEL Translate business meaning into governed definitions and relationships.	04 Build the Solution VALIDATED KPIS Develop and test the controlled source-to-decision implementation.
05 Deliver Insights EXECUTIVE DECISIONS Release decision-ready evidence, caveats, and accountable actions.	06 Sustain & Evolve AI INTELLIGENCE & MONITORING Monitor fitness, govern change, and improve within approved boundaries.

STAGES 01-03

Establish the decision, governance, and business meaning before build.

The first half of the lifecycle creates the controlled baseline that prevents later technical work from outrunning purpose, ownership, source authority, or semantic meaning.

01 Discover & Align SOURCE TRUTH	Purpose: Clarify the executive decision, stakeholders, scope, source landscape, and operating challenge. Evidence: Discovery baseline, Reporting Contract, source inventory, scope boundaries, assumptions, and initial risks. Exit condition: The decision purpose, scope, source landscape, stakeholders, and material unknowns are explicit.
02 Decision Foundation GOVERNANCE	Purpose: Define authority, ownership, boundaries, review roles, and the evidence required for a release decision. Evidence: Decision rights, governance map, risk register, acceptance criteria, security boundaries, and change authority. Exit condition: Accountability, approval boundaries, and release criteria are defined and reviewable.
03 Define Intelligence SEMANTIC MODEL	Purpose: Translate the operating question into governed populations, grains, dimensions, measures, relationships, and caveats. Evidence: KPI contracts, semantic rules, population definitions, lineage, effective dates, exception handling, and test cases. Exit condition: Business meaning is sufficiently complete to guide implementation and QA.

STAGES 04-06

Build, release, monitor, and improve through retained evidence.

The second half converts the approved foundation into a controlled decision system, then sustains fitness for purpose as sources, decisions, and operating conditions change.

04 Build the Solution VALIDATED KPIS	Purpose: Develop the governed source-to-decision implementation and validate each technical and business layer. Evidence: Source and staging logic, semantic model, relationships, measures, metadata, security checks, reconciliation, and QA results. Exit condition: The implementation meets the defined acceptance criteria or retains explicit exceptions and remediation decisions.
05 Deliver Insights EXECUTIVE DECISIONS	Purpose: Release decision-ready experiences, briefings, caveats, actions, and accountable ownership. Evidence: Release-readiness record, known limitations, signoff, decision brief, action ownership, and communication evidence. Exit condition: Authorized users understand the evidence, limits, decision context, and required action.
06 Sustain & Evolve AI INTELLIGENCE & MONITORING	Purpose: Monitor fitness, govern change, retain evidence, and improve only within approved boundaries. Evidence: Monitoring results, issue log, change decisions, version history, adoption observations, retraining evidence, and retirement criteria. Exit condition: Material changes are classified, reviewed, tested, and released through the same controlled lifecycle.

EVIDENCE MODEL

Trust is retained through standards, artifacts, QA, authorization, and monitoring.

A decision system is not governed because a dashboard exists. It is governed when business purpose, source authority, semantic meaning, quality evidence, release authorization, and continued fitness can be demonstrated.

Standards and contracts	Reporting Contract, source authority, grain, KPI contracts, semantic rules, security boundaries, and acceptance criteria.
Versioned artifacts	Inventories, lineage, transformations, models, measures, tests, caveats, decisions, and release records.
Quality and reconciliation	Completeness, accuracy, relationship, measure, security, presentation, and source-to-output checks.
Release authorization	A bounded decision identifies what is ready, conditionally ready, requires remediation, or is not approved for the intended use.
Monitoring and change	Source drift, definition changes, defects, usage context, access, and retirement conditions remain reviewable.
Human accountability	Named owners interpret evidence, decide within authority, communicate limits, and retain responsibility for action.

Release-readiness principle
Release status is an evidence decision, not a badge. The required proof varies by intended use, data sensitivity, operating risk, and the authority of the decision being supported.

Workforce Intelligence Accelerator	Connect workforce demand, supply, movement, capacity, and productivity to accountable operating decisions.	The framework aligns population rules and source authority before modeling, then retains scenario, QA, caveat, and release evidence.
Power BI Release Readiness Assessment	Determine whether a Power BI asset is fit for its intended decision context and what must be remediated.	The assessment traces the asset from source through transformations, semantic model, measures, security, report bindings, reconciliation, and release criteria.
Managed Executive Analytics	Sustain governed reporting, monitoring, decision support, and controlled improvement over time.	Stage 6 becomes the operating cadence while material changes return through discovery, governance, definition, implementation, and release review.
